St Paul has a foot on a Roman capital (decoration at the top of an architectural column) representing his preaching, which converted many Gentiles. Books/scrolls represent preaching or writing. Quills represent martyrdom. A staff represents a pilgrim or traveler.

The Crucifixion is of original design and was repainted on the same canvas by the artist after it was damaged by fire. The Holy Spirit was drawn from old images to match the original, which had been overpainted several times. The stenciling is of original design, as frames for the sanctuary artwork; it covered John E Dohan's work (floral, filigree, and abstract patterns in sanctuary and nave) from 1884. The consecration crosses are unlabeled: Four are painted between H2/H3 and H5/H6 and six are underneath the paired Stations on the east and west nave walls; the remaining two are on the narthex wall above the Holy Water fonts.
